



The top 4 causes of fatal crashes due to aggressive driving:

- Speeding
- Running red lights or stop signs
- Making unsafe lane changes
- Failing to merge into oncoming traffic safely



In Delaware, being charged with aggressive driving could result in:

- A fine between \$100 and \$300 and/or 10 to 30 days in jail
- Attending an 8-hour behavior modification driving class

Aggressive driving statistics:

- 55% of Delaware traffic deaths are related to aggressive driving
- One-third of all Delaware aggressive driving-related crashes are caused by 16- to 19-year-old drivers
- Males are twice as likely as females to be involved in an aggressive driving-related crash
- Time of greatest risk for aggressive driving-related crashes in Delaware: between noon and 8 p.m.

So always drive safely. And if you see anyone driving aggressively, whether they're speeding, tailgating, or running stop signs or red lights, call 9-1-1.
